To the Student:

We appreciate your spiritual interest and hope you find this study helpful. Please read through these following facts and instructions, especially if you have never studied the Bible before. We believe it will make you more confident as you search for verses and learn your way around the different books.

- The Bible is divided into two sections: the Old Testament and New Testament. The Old Testament was written before Jesus came to earth. The New Testament was written after Jesus died. The entire Bible is important and relevant for us today.
- 2. There are 66 books in the Bible: 39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New. God gave us the Bible over a span of 1,600 years. He used over 40 men to write the Bible.
- 3. The Bible is God's Word to man (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21). When we speak of God's Word, we are referring to the text of the Bible, not to any notes that men have added.
- 4. In this study the Bible verses are written in italics. When you see a verse such as *John 3:16*, this means the book of *John*, chapter 3, verse 16.
- 5. If you do not know where to find a book of the Bible, look in the Table of Contents. Normally this is in the very beginning of your Bible. The Old Testament books are listed first; the New Testament books are listed second.

INTRODUCTION

Nobody likes to be fooled; we all want to know the truth. But what is truth? Pilate, the Roman governor of Judaea, asked this very question of Jesus. Philosophers and theologians have asked this question throughout the ages.

Yet, even though we might want to know the truth, the Bible says that people have a tendency to change God's truth to lies, and that there will be a time when people will turn away from the truth and instead begin to follow fables, or myths. So, how can you tell the difference?

God's Word, the Bible, claims to be truth. It does not claim to contain all truth about all subjects, but it claims to speak the truth on every issue it addresses. If God says something about a subject, it is true. God is the God of truth.

This study exposes eight common myths about God, the Bible and you. We invite you to examine each myth and what God says about it. We encourage you to be like the people of Berea during the New Testament era; they were described as noble because they were willing to hear what the Bible said and then to read it for themselves to see if it was really true.

Don't be fooled; don't believe in myths. Examine for yourself what God has said, and you can know the truth. Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, I find in him no fault [at all].

LESSON ONE

MYTH: "I CAN'T KNOW GOD; HE IS FAR AWAY AND

IMPERSONAL."

Truth: God has revealed Himself and has

A teacher asked his class one day to describe what they thought his father looked like. One by one, the students described how they thought his father looked according to the teacher's appearance. Because the teacher was tall and dark-skinned, they assumed his father was the same. Because the teacher had brown eyes, they assumed his father had brown eyes. After making guesses about the father, the teacher revealed a photograph of him that surprised them all. Contrary to what seemed logical, the teacher's father was short, light-skinned and had blue eyes.

Men and women throughout history have always tried to know God. You might look around at the world and try figure out if there is a God, and if He is there, who is He? What is He like? You may even conclude, after much thought, that there is a God. But you cannot know Him just by observing the world around you, because you lack the information you need to know Him. You may guess what He is like, and some of your guesses may be right. But, as in the case of the teacher's father, it is likely that some of your guesses will be very wrong.

God Himself has provided the information you need to know Him in His book, the Bible. The Bible consists of 66 books and was written over a span of 1600 years. He chose about 40 different men to write different parts of the Bible. He revealed himself to these men and inspired them so they would not make any errors. He provided the Bible for us and reveals

Himself in it so we do not have to imagine what God is like—we can know for sure.

LESSON TWO WHAT DOES GOD SAY ABOUT GOING TO HEAVEN?

MYTH: "I COULD NEVER KNOW FOR SURE IF I WILL GO TO HEAVEN."

TRUTH: GOD HAS TOLD YOU VERY CLEARLY HOW YOU CAN BE SURE YOU WILL GO TO HEAVEN WHEN YOU DIE.

You have already learned that you cannot know God unless He reveals Himself to you. The same is true for the question of how to get to Heaven.

You do not want to risk being wrong on such an important matter.

Moreover, it is not hidden from you. How to get eternal life is revealed clearly and simply in God's Word, the Bible.

Is there any way you can know for sure you are going to Heaven when you die? It is often said, "All religions are the same," or "It doesn't matter what you believe, all religions lead to God." It is true that there are many similarities among religions. But what the Bible teaches on the subject of eternal life is actually the opposite of what is taught by every other religion in the world.

You may be thinking, "God is love. He would not send anyone to Hell." But the truth is that God is perfect; He is a perfect Judge. A perfect Judge cannot overlook sin. Sin must be paid for.

"But," you might object, "We have just said that God cannot overlook sin. How could He ever just *give* me a gift of salvation when I have not earned it?" This is a good question, which is answered in our next three important truths.

Jesus Christ was your *substitute*. In other words, Jesus died *instead* of you. When He died on the cross He took your place, was punished instead of you, and paid the penalty that was required for your sins.

TRUTH #5 (John 3:16) Whoever ______in Jesus has everlasting life.

Notice this verse does not say, "Whosoever goes to church," "Whosoever is a good person," or "Whosoever tries to follow the Ten Commandments."

The word *believe* means *trust*. To have eternal life, you must place your trust *not* in anything good you have done, but *only in what Christ has already done for you*. You must believe Him

when He tells you that He has already paid for every sin you have ever committed.

TRUTH #6 (*John 1:12*) When you receive Jesus by believing in Him and accepting His free gift of salvation, you become a______of God.

Salvation is a gift that you can accept or reject. When you accept the gift you will become His child and live forever with Him in Heaven.

You can simply pray to Him right now. Prayer does not save you. It is simply your way of telling Him that you are trusting what He has done for you. Tell Him you are a sinner and that you believe He died for you. Tell Him you accept His free gift of salvation that He has provided for you. Thank Him for the love He has shown for you by making a way to spend eternity with Him in Heaven.

LESSON THREE WHAT DOES GOD SAY ABOUT MY RELATIONSHIP WITH HIM?

MYTH: TRUTH:

In the last lesson we studied what the Bible teaches about eternal life. We learned that in all other religions, going to Heaven is based on what you must do for God. In the Bible, however, true salvation is based on trusting what God has already done for you.

When you trust Jesus as your Savior, all of your sins are forgiven (*Psalm* 103:12). You are *saved* (*Ephesians* 2:8); you can also say you have been born again (*John* 3:3) You become a child of God in that you enter into a father/child relationship with God Himself (*John* 1:12). This relationship cannot be reversed. This security you have in your relationship with God is what we will discuss in this lesson.

What did Jesus mean when He said "It is finished?" He did not mean His life was finished, because three days after His death God the Father raised Him from the dead, and Christ was alive again (John 20:1-9). Jesus showed himself to many people to prove He truly was alive (John 20:20, 27, 29; 21:1, 12-14).

When Christ said, "It is finished," He meant that He had made the full payment for the sins of the world; the work of salvation was complete. Christ rose from the dead three days after His death; His resurrection proved that He (God the Father) was satisfied with the payment Christ had made.

LESSON FOUR WHAT DOES GOD SAY ABOUT LIVING THE CHRISTIAN LIFE?

MYTH: "IF I BECOME A CHRISTIAN, THEN I WILL NOT HAVE ANY MORE PROBLEMS AND STRUGGLES."

TRUTH: As a CHRISTIAN YOU WILL STILL HAVE

TROUBLES, BUT GOD GIVES YOU EVERYTHING YOU NEED IN THE BIBLE TO DEAL WITH THE

PROBLEMS AND STRUGGLES OF LIFE.

God has said that everyone in the world has sinned (*Romans 3:23*). We are all born sinners (*Psalm 51:5*). We are born with a sinful nature; we are naturally inclined toward evil. Children do not have to be taught to do wrong; instead, they must be trained to do what is right. We need laws, courts, policemen, and locks on our doors. The Bible calls our sinful nature the *old man*, or *the flesh*. Before a person trusts Christ he is a slave to this old nature; he is a slave to sin.

When you trust Christ and receive His free gift of salvation you receive a new nature from God. The Bible calls this new nature the *new man*. Christ now lives in you (Colossians 1:27). You might wonder why there is a struggle inside of you even after you have trusted Christ. Your struggle comes from the many tendencies and habits you have in you that make it easy to act like the *old man* is still in control.

So, how can you possibly live the Christian life? In God's Word, the Bible, He has given you everything you need to live a life of victory (2 Peter 1:3). Even though you may experience spiritual struggles, you are able to conquer sin through the power of the Holy Spirit. You are no longer a slave to sin. Whereas before you could not please God, now you have the potential to become like Christ and to live a life that is pleasing to Him.

God gave us His Word so that we can trust Him for salvation. But we also need the Bible in our everyday lives. After you become a Christian you need the Bible so you can know God, have a close relationship with Him, and live a life that is pleasing to Him (2 Corinthians 5:9).

The Bible says that once you have trusted Christ as your Savior you are adopted into God's family (Romans 8:15-17; Galatians 4:4-7; Ephesians 1:5). Think for a moment about your earthly father/child relationship. If you were adopted into a family that you had never met, at first you would not know anything about your new father. You could try to imagine his personality and what he looked like. But even if you thought for a long time, you would probably still come up with a distorted picture of him in your mind. Imagine that you wanted to give your new father a gift the weekend you were going to meet him. Even if you really wanted to please him with a perfect gift, it would be nearly impossible. With no knowledge of his personality, likes, dislikes, etc., you would have no idea where to start. What you might do is give him something that you like, hoping he would be pleased with it.

Reading the Bible is vital because there is no way you can know about God unless He tells you about Himself. Studying about Him in the Bible is the only way you know His personality, His likes, and His dislikes. We

- 8. There are many different ways to study the Bible. The following are three suggestions that will help you get started.
 - A) Read one chapter in the book of *Proverbs* each day. There are 31 chapters in this book. Read the one that corresponds to the day of the month. For example, on the first of the month read *Proverbs* 1, on the second day read *Proverbs* 2, etc.
 - B) Read verse by verse through the Bible by reading a portion of the Old Testament, followed by a portion of the New Testament. Try to read through the Bible in a year.
 - C) Study one book of the Bible at a time. Many find the book of *John* a good place to start.

Every time you read the Bible, you need to promise God that:
When He shows you truth, you will believe it;
When He shows you His will, you will do it; and
When He shows you your sin, you will confess it and forsake it.

It is important to have a quiet place and a particular time set aside to read the Bible. Can you think of a particular place and time you can meet with God every day? Commit to God that you will be faithful to meet with Him daily so He can speak to you through His Word, the Bible.

In Lesson Five you learned about the importance of reading your Bible. You must allow God to talk to you regularly. Another critical part of your relationship with God is the discipline of *prayer*. To have a relationship with God, you must talk to Him (pray to Him) regularly.

God has commanded Christians to pray; He wants you to communicate with Him in prayer just as He communicates with you when you read His Word. In this lesson we will discuss the importance of prayer. As you get to know God better by spending time in His Word you will become more effective in your prayer life. You will also learn of how God has instructed you to approach Him in prayer and how you must not do anything to hinder your prayers to Him.

LESSON EIGHT WHAT DOES GOD SAY ABOUT TALKING TO UNBELIEVERS?

MYTH: "FAITH IS A PERSONAL THING; I DO NOT NEED

TO TALK ABOUT IT."

TRUTH: GOD HAS CHOSEN TO USE PEOPLE TO TELL

PEOPLE ABOUT HIMSELF. IT IS YOUR

RESPONSIBILITY TO SPREAD THE GOOD NEWS

OF JESUS CHRIST.

In Lesson Two we learned about how to be sure you are going to Heaven. We learned that Christ died and rose again, and that when you trust Him as your Savior He will give you the gift of eternal life (1 Corinthians 15:3-4; John 3:16). This message is called the Gospel. The word gospel means good news. God has chosen men to spread the good news of the Gospel. If you have trusted Christ as Savior, you have the responsibility to tell others the good news of what Jesus Christ has done for you.

Read 2 Corinthians 5:20. In this verse the Apostle Paul explains that after you have been saved Christ gives you a very important job to do for Him. According to this verse, what is your new position?
In this new position, what message are you called to give to others?

An *ambassador* is a representative, or messenger, to another country (not his own). His leader appoints him for a special job. His responsibility is not to accomplish his own agenda, but to do the will of the one who has sent him.

To be *reconciled* means to be brought back into a right relationship. The only way sinners can be reconciled to God is through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

It is very important to <i>know the gospel message well</i> . The Gospel is very simple. Can you remember where in the New Testament the Gospel is clearly defined (see Lesson Two, Truth #4)? Write the Scripture reference here:
In these verses, how does the Apostle Paul define the Gospel?
When you communicate the Gospel, it is helpful to know these five truths:
TRUTH #1 – The pure Gospel is powerful.
Read <i>Romans 1:16-17</i> . How did the Apostle Paul describe the Gospel, and why?
Read <i>Galatians 1:6-10</i> . Paul wrote these verses to a church that had received some false teaching. These false teachers claimed that in order to be saved it was necessary to believe <i>and</i> to follow the law. What does Paul say about anyone who changes the message of the Gospel? What should be our goal in preaching the pure Gospel (v. 10)?

Remember that your job as an ambassador is to do the will of the One who has sent you. As you give the Gospel to others you must be careful to communicate only the pure Gospel of Jesus Christ. If you have given the impression a person can do something other than trust Christ to be saved (e.g., clean up his life, go to church, say a prayer, walk an aisle) then you have not communicated the true Gospel of grace.

TRUTH #2 – God expects you to tell the world; He does not expect
you to save the world.
Read 2 Corinthians 4:3-4. Why will some not respond to the Gospel?
Read <i>John 6:44</i> . What must God do for a person to be saved?

TRUTH #3 – It is normal for you to be fearful to give the Gospel.
If anyone would be a model for us, it would be the Apostle Paul. Read <i>1 Corinthians 2:1-5</i> . How does Paul describe his experience in preaching the Gospel?

TRUTH #4 – You don't give the Gospel to someone because you feel like it; you give it out of thankfulness and obedience to God.
Read <i>Matthew 9:36-38</i> . What does Jesus Christ say about the lost, and what does He command you to do?
Read <i>Matthew 28:19-20</i> . What were Jesus' last words to His disciples, and what was His promise to them?
TRUTH #5 – To give the Gospel to someone, you do not have to be perfect or know all of the answers.
Read 2 Timothy 2:22-26. In verses 22-25, what instructions does Timothy give to you?

According to <i>verses 25 and 26</i> , why should you follow these instructions?
According to 1 Peter 3:15-16, what are your responsibilities to the unbeliever, and why?
God has given you the privilege of communicating the Gospel to a lost world. If you truly love God and are thankful for what He has done for you through Jesus Christ, you should be willing to do His will by telling others about Him. If you do not know what to say, you can simply give your <i>testimony</i> , which is the account of how you came to trust Christ as Savior.
Will you commit to God to be obedient by actively seeking opportunities to tell others about Him?

Can you recall any time in your life before you became a Christian that someone tried to share the Gospel with you? Tell about what happened, and how you responded.
